INTRODUCTION

The following is a draft proposal to expand the Sunday readings in the Lectionary for Mass¹ in the Latin Rite of the Roman Catholic Church. The goal is to read more of Sacred Scripture on Sundays by increasing the three-year cycle of Sunday readings to a four-year cycle. This would be accomplished by adding a Year D that would be based on the Gospel according to John, just as the Years A, B, and C are based on the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke, respectively. This draft proposal for the Sunday Lectionary is a sequel to *A Proposal to Expand the Weekday Lectionary*. The purpose of the first proposal was to read *all* of the Sacred Scriptures during the Liturgy of the Word, primarily by increasing the two-year cycle of First Readings for weekdays in Ordinary Time to a ten-year cycle. The purpose of this second proposal is simply to provide a year for the fourth Gospel, thereby allowing more readings from Sacred Scripture to be read on Sundays, when far more of the faithful attend Mass.

This second proposal (for Sundays) incorporates basically the same principles contained in the Introduction to the first proposal (for weekdays). The pertinent principles for Sundays are repeated here in this second proposal. As in the first proposal, no changes are proposed to the liturgical calendar. The *structure* of the Liturgy of the Word is also maintained, that is, a Gospel passage would be read at every Mass, the First Reading would be followed by a Responsorial Psalm, and on Sundays and festive days there would be a Second Reading before the Gospel.

The motivation for the proposed changes is to provide a way for more of the Sacred Scriptures to be heard on Sundays in the liturgical context where the faithful gather to nourish and express their faith together. The church teaches that the Scriptures are the inspired word of God. As Saint Paul says, "All scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work" (2 Tim 3:16-17). The 2008 Synod of Bishops on the theme of "The Word of God in the Life and Mission of the Church" recommended "that an examination be carried out of the Roman Lectionary to see if the current selection and ordering of the readings is truly adequate to the mission of the church in this historical moment."² The Introduction to the Lectionary reminds us, "The people of God have a spiritual right to receive abundantly from the treasury of God's word."³ And again, "the Church's desire is that a more lavish table of the word of God be spread before the faithful" (GIL 83). "The Sacred Scriptures, above all in their liturgical proclamation, are the source of life and strength" (GIL 47).

Each of the years in the Sunday cycle is designated by the letter A, B, C, or D. The following is the procedure to determine which year is A, B, C, or D. The letter D designates a year whose number is divisible into four equal parts, as though the cycle had taken its beginning from the first year of the Christian era. Thus, the year 1 would have been Year A; year 2, Year B;

year 3, Year C; year 4, Year D (as would years 8, 12, and 16). Thus, for example, year 2020 is Year D; 2021, Year A; 2022, Year B; 2023, Year C; and 2024, Year D again. And so forth. The Gospel readings for Ordinary Time of each year of the four-year cycle are drawn from one of the four Gospels. Thus the first Year of the cycle is the Year for the reading of the Gospel of Matthew and is so named; the second, third, and fourth Years are the Year of Mark, the Year of Luke, and the Year of John (see GIL 66, footnote 102).

Special Treatment for Particular Books

In the liturgical year, the Proper of Seasons is defined by the episodes in the life of Christ that are presented in the Gospels, and appropriate Gospel passages are assigned to be read during those seasons. Thus, passages concerning the birth, childhood, and baptism of Jesus are read during the Advent and Christmas seasons (except for the baptism narrative from the Gospel according to John, which is currently read on the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time, Year A). The passages about the temptations of Christ in the desert are read on the First Sunday of Lent. And the passion and resurrection narratives are read during Holy Week and the Easter season, respectively. The current Lectionary states, "In the semicontinuous reading of Luke for Year C, the introduction of this Gospel has been prefixed to the first text (that is, on the Third Sunday). This passage expresses the author's intention very beautifully and there seemed to be no better place for it" (GIL 105). This draft proposal instead prefixes the introduction of Luke's Gospel (1:1-4) to the weekday Gospel reading (Luke 1:5-25) for December 19 in Advent, thus providing a continuous reading. So, Luke 1:1-4 will not be read on a Sunday. Also, the baptism narrative from John's Gospel will be moved to the new Year D.

On the Sundays of Easter, all of the passages in the last chapter of each of the Synoptic Gospels and the last two chapters of the Gospel of John will be read. See *Appendix 1* for the rationale of these decisions.

The tradition of reading the Acts of the Apostles during the Easter season is maintained. But the Sundays of Easter have been integrated with the weekdays so that a continuous reading of the whole book could take place from Easter Sunday until the Saturday before Pentecost. (Ascension Thursday breaks the continuous reading, but the First Reading on that day is nevertheless from Acts, as is the First Reading on Pentecost, the last day of the Easter season.) So the First Readings for the Sundays of Easter would be the same each year. There would no longer be a three-year (nor a four-year) cycle for the First Readings on these Sundays. An average of twenty-one verses per day from the Acts of the Apostles would thus be read during the Easter season. (See *Appendix 2* for details.)

A portion (eight verses) of the Letter of St. Paul to Philemon is currently read on the Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C. Since the letter is relatively short (twenty-five verses), it is proposed that the entire letter be read (on the Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C). It is not until verse 16 that the situation of the letter becomes clear with the mention that Onesimus is a fugitive slave, so it would not be easy to break up the letter into two parts for reading on weekdays in Ordinary Time.

In the Liturgy of the Word, the Responsorial Psalm "should correspond [*respondeat*]" to the First Reading and "fosters meditation on the Word of God"⁴ in that reading. Appropriate Psalm verses are selected to follow a given First Reading.

The Length of the Texts

In the current Lectionary, the longest readings are the passion narratives of the four Gospels, from Matthew (128 verses), from Mark (119 verses), from Luke (114 verses), and from John (82 verses). Aside from the passion narratives, one of the longest readings is the passage from John 11:1-45 about the raising of Lazarus (45 verses). The reading from the Susanna story (in Daniel 13) on Monday of the Fifth Week of Lent is 54 verses. So there are some long readings already in the current Lectionary.

As in the current Lectionary, in regard to the length of texts, "A distinction has been made between narratives, which require reading a fairly long passage, but which usually hold the attention of the faithful, and texts that should not be lengthy because of the profundity of their doctrine" (GIL 75) or the complexity or density of their content. Subjective decisions had to be made as to where to divide the verses of a particular book. This draft proposal is just that—a first attempt to provide a way to read more of the books of the Bible in the liturgy. Obviously, other choices could have been made and can still be made to accomplish that same end.

In the current Lectionary, "In the case of certain rather lengthy texts, longer and shorter versions are provided to suit different situations" (GIL 75). In this draft proposal, any verses that were omitted in a reading in the current Lectionary have been included in the newly proposed longer version.

Difficult Texts

The current Lectionary states:

In readings for Sundays and solemnities, texts that present real difficulties are avoided for pastoral reasons. The difficulties may be objective, in that the texts themselves raise profound literary, critical, or exegetical problems; or the difficulties may lie, at least to a certain extent, in the ability of the faithful to understand the texts. But there could be no justification for concealing from the faithful the spiritual riches of certain texts on the grounds of difficulty if the problem arises from the inadequacy either of the religious education that every Christian should have or of the biblical formation that every pastor of souls should have. Often a difficult reading is clarified by its correlation with another in the same Mass. (GIL 76)

In 2010, in his apostolic exhortation *Verbum Domini* (The Word of the Lord) following the 2008 Synod of Bishops on the Word of God in the Life and Mission of the Church, Pope Benedict XVI wrote:

In discussing the relationship between the Old and the New Testaments, the Synod also considered those passages in the Bible which, due to the violence and immorality they occasionally contain, prove obscure and difficult. Here it must be remembered first and foremost that biblical revelation is deeply rooted in history. God's plan is manifested progressively and it is accomplished slowly, in successive stages and despite human resistance. God chose a people and patiently worked to guide and educate them. Revelation is suited to the cultural and moral level of distant times and thus describes facts and customs, such as cheating and trickery, and acts of violence and massacre, without explicitly denouncing the immorality of such things. This can be explained by the historical context, yet it can cause the modern reader to be taken aback, especially if he or she fails to take account of the many "dark" deeds carried out down the centuries, and also in our own day. In the Old Testament, the preaching of the prophets vigorously challenged every kind of injustice and violence, whether collective or individual, and thus became God's way of training his people in preparation for the Gospel. So it would be a mistake to neglect those passages of Scripture that strike us as problematic [italics added]. Rather, we should be aware that the correct interpretation of these passages requires a degree of expertise, acquired through a training that interprets the texts in their historical-literary context and within the Christian perspective which has as its ultimate hermeneutical key "the Gospel and the new commandment of Jesus Christ brought about in the paschal mystery" [Propositio 29]. I encourage scholars and pastors to help all the faithful to approach these passages through an interpretation which enables their meaning to emerge in the light of the mystery of Christ.⁵

This draft proposal does not avoid any texts of the canonical Scriptures, but obviously even a four-year Sunday Lectionary cannot include all of the Sacred Scriptures, so subjective decisions have been made as to which new passages to include and which passages not to include. No passages in the current Lectionary for Sundays have been intentionally omitted in the proposed Sunday Lectionary, except Luke 1:1-4 as mentioned above.

The Omission of Certain Verses within a Reading

The current Lectionary states:

The omission of verses in readings from Scripture has at times been the tradition of many liturgies, including the Roman liturgy. Admittedly such omissions may not be made lightly, for fear of distorting the meaning of the text or the intent and style of Scripture. Yet on pastoral grounds it was decided to continue the traditional practice in the present Order of Readings, but at the same time to ensure that the essential meaning of the text

remained intact. One reason for the decision is that otherwise some texts would have been unduly long. It would also have been necessary to omit completely certain readings of high spiritual value for the faithful because those readings include some verse that is pastorally less useful or that involves truly difficult questions. (GIL 77)

This draft proposal recommends that whenever any canonical verses are omitted in a given reading, an optional full version also be provided so that the meaning of the passage will be more fully available from the context and structure of the passage. This draft proposal has tried to divide long or difficult passages into short pieces wherever possible to make them more digestible, but it seems that there is a pastoral usefulness for the faithful to know that there are difficult passages in the inspired Scriptures, so that the faithful do not have a simplistic view of the word of God. Even passages that are seemingly boring or hard to read aloud, such as genealogies, lists of place names, and so on, are part of the inspired text, part of the way God has spoken and still speaks to his people. Such texts tell us something about God, at least that he is the kind of God who would inspire such texts. This draft proposal maintains the option of longer and shorter versions for certain readings on Sundays and festive days.

The Biblical References

The books of the Sacred Scriptures were delineated by the Council of Trent in 1546. After listing all of the canonical books, the Council continued, "If anyone does not accept as sacred and canonical the aforesaid books in their entirety and with all their parts, as they have been accustomed to be read in the Catholic Church and as they are contained in the old Latin Vulgate Edition, and knowingly and deliberately rejects the aforesaid traditions, let him be anathema."⁶ Thus the Vulgate is the standard for identifying the canonical Scriptures. The 2001 instruction Liturgiam Authenticam, On the Use of Vernacular Languages in the Publication of the Books of the Roman Liturgy, from the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, states that "the Nova Vulgata Editio is the point of reference as regards the delineation of the canonical text."⁷ So that is the text of the Bible that has been used in the preparation of this draft proposal. Sometimes the Nova Vulgata omits a verse or verses (e.g., Matt 17:21) along with the verse number. So in Matthew 17, verse 20 is followed by verse 22. In this draft proposal, as in the current Lectionary, "[t]he text reference (that is, to chapter and verses) is given according to the Neo-Vulgate edition ... But a second reference according to the original text (Hebrew, Aramaic, or Greek) has been added wherever there is a discrepancy" (GIL 119).

Explanation of the Apparatus Used for the Listings

In the following list of readings, the current Lectionary references are printed in black. New chapter and verse numbers are printed in red. A red asterisk (*) means that the proposed longer form of the reading would be a new alternative to the original reading which thus becomes a "shorter form." A black asterisk (*) indicates that the reading already had a longer and a shorter form. Readings that have been moved to a new location are highlighted in yellow.

The guiding text for referencing the psalms will be the same as the referencing text used in the first proposal for weekdays, namely the *Nova Vulgata*, 2nd edition online. The chapter and verse numbering of the psalms in the *Nova Vulgata* basically follows that of the Hebrew text found in the *Biblia Hebraica Stuttgartensia*. The old Vulgate numbering coincided with the numbering in the Greek Septuagint. Where the *Nova Vulgata* chapter numbering differs from the old Vulgate chapter numbering the *Nova Vulgata* includes the old Vulgate chapter numbering in parentheses after the Hebrew chapter numbering. The following listings will use only the Hebrew chapter numbering as found in the *Nova Vulgata*. As in the current Lectionary, in any reference to the first or second verse that includes part of a superscription, the superscription is not to be sung or read. For example, Ps 11:1 contains the superscription "For the Choirmaster. Of David." and the beginning of the psalm proper "In the Lord I take refuge . . ." The Responsorial Psalm reference will be Ps 11:1, but the superscription will not be sung or read.

Principles Used in the Selection of Readings

For the selection of the Gospel reading, the First Reading with its Responsorial Psalm, and the Second Reading, the following principles have been used.

- 1) Where possible, all the current readings from John's Gospel in the Years A, B, and C have been moved to Year D. Some passages from John's Gospel will still be read in Years A, B, and C.
- 2) Over the course of the four-year cycle of Sundays, all the verses of John's Gospel and all the verses of Mark's Gospel will be read. Certain passages from Matthew's and Luke's Gospels that were omitted in the current Lectionary have been included in the proposed Lectionary by dropping other passages that will have parallels in the proposed Lectionary.
- 3) Over the course of the four-year cycle, there will be at least one reading from each book of the canon.
- 4) In the four-year cycle of Sundays, a reading will not be used more than once, except when it is used on multiple years (A, B, C, and/or D) of a given Sunday. The three exceptions are John 1:1-18* on Christmas Day and the Second Sunday after Christmas, John 18:1–19:42 on Palm Sunday D and Good Friday, and Matt 28:16-20 on Ascension A and Holy Trinity B.
- 5) The priority in the sequence of days to follow in selecting or confirming readings coincides with the precedence of liturgical days, namely: The Paschal Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Sunday) Christmas, Epiphany, Ascension, and Pentecost Sundays of the Advent, Lent, and Easter seasons Ash Wednesday Weekdays of Holy Week from Monday up to and including Thursday Days within the Octave of Easter Solemnities of the Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and Saints The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls) Feasts of the Lord Sundays of Christmas Time and the Sundays in Ordinary Time Feasts of the Blessed Virgin Mary and of the Saints.⁸
- 6) In order to facilitate ecumenical use of this Lectionary, readings from deuterocanonical books of the Old Testament found currently in the Proper of Seasons have been moved to Ordinary Time. The four readings are:

Bar 3:9-15, 32–4:4 formerly in the Easter Vigil Bar 5:1-9 formerly on Second Sunday of Advent, Year C Sir 3:3-7, 14-17a formerly on First Sunday after Christmas (Holy Family), Year A Sir 24:1-4, 12-16 formerly on Second Sunday after Christmas.

- 7) In selecting readings for a given day, the Gospel has been picked first, then the First Reading, then the Responsorial Psalm, then the Second Reading.
- 8) When a current Gospel reading has been moved to a different location, the accompanying First Reading, Responsorial Psalm, and Second Reading have been moved along with the Gospel, unless the current First or Second Reading does not correspond directly to the Gospel reading, or in the new location the First or Second Reading would not correspond directly to the Gospel reading. This would happen, for example, when, in the Season of Lent, the First Readings are about "the main elements of salvation history from its beginning until the promise of the New Covenant" (GIL 97), or when, in the Easter Season or Ordinary Time, the Second Readings are semicontinuous. In these cases, the First Reading with its Responsorial Psalm and/or the Second Reading are replaced with completely new readings.
- 9) The selection of completely new Scripture readings has been guided by the themes in the current Lectionary (GIL 92-108), namely:
 - a. Advent
 - i. Gospel:
 - 1. First Sunday: the Lord's coming at the end of time
 - 2. Second and Third Sunday: John the Baptist [Proposed Lectionary Third Sunday Year C: the Annunciation]
 - 3. Fourth Sunday: events that prepared immediately for the Lord's birth
 - ii. First Reading: prophecies about the Messiah and the Messianic age, especially from the book of Isaiah
 - iii. Second Reading: exhortations and proclamations in keeping with the different themes of Advent
 - b. The Christmas Season
 - i. Christmas: readings chosen from the Roman tradition
 - ii. Sunday within the Octave of Christmas (Holy Family):
 - 1. Gospel: Jesus' childhood
 - 2. First and Second Readings: virtues of family life
 - iii. Octave of Christmas: Virgin Mother of God and the Name of Jesus
 - iv. Second Sunday after Christmas: the mystery of the incarnation
 - v. Epiphany:
 - 1. Gospel and First Reading: from the Roman tradition
 - 2. Second Reading: the calling of the nations to salvation
 - vi. Baptism of the Lord: texts about this mystery
 - c. Lent
 - i. Gospel
 - 1. First Sunday: the temptation of the Lord
 - 2. Second Sunday: the transfiguration of the Lord
 - 3. Third Sunday

- a. Year A [proposed Year D]: the Samaritan woman [Proposed Year A: from Matthew about repentance]
- b. Year B: from John about Christ's coming glorification through his cross and resurrection
- c. Year C: from Luke about conversion
- d. [Year D: the Samaritan woman]
- 4. Fourth Sunday
 - a. Year A [proposed Year D]: the man born blind [Proposed Year A: from John about Jesus' prediction of betrayal]
 - b. Year B: from John about Christ's coming glorification through his cross and resurrection
 - c. Year C: from Luke about conversion
 - d. [Year D: the man born blind]
- 5. Fifth Sunday
 - a. Year A [Proposed Year D]: the raising of Lazarus [Proposed Year A: from John about the world's hatred]
 - b. Year B: from John about Christ's coming glorification through his cross and resurrection
 - c. Year C: from John about Jesus' forgiveness
 - d. [Year D: the raising of Lazarus]
- 6. Palm Sunday
 - a. Procession: the Lord's solemn entry into Jerusalem
 - b. Mass: the Lord's passion
- ii. First Reading: the main elements of salvation history from its beginning until the promise of the New Covenant
- iii. Second Reading: selected to fit the Gospel and the First Reading and, to the extent possible, to provide a connection between them
- d. The Easter Season
 - i. Gospel: See Appendix 1
 - ii. First Reading: from the Acts of the Apostles
 - iii. Second Reading: the spirit of joyous faith and sure hope proper to this season
 - 1. Year A: 1 Peter
 - 2. Year B: 1 John
 - 3. Year C: the book of Revelation [1–7; summary of appearances of the risen Lord (1 Cor 15:1-11)]
 - 4. [Year D: the book of Revelation 19–22]
- e. Solemnity of the Ascension
 - i. First Reading: the ascension according to the Acts of the Apostles
 - ii. Second Reading: Christ in exaltation at the right hand of the Father
 - iii. Gospel: text in accord with the differences in the Gospels

- f. Solemnity of Pentecost
 - i. Vigil
 - 1. First four readings: from the Old Testament
 - 2. The Apostle: the actual working of the Holy Spirit in the Church
 - 3. Gospel: the promise of the Spirit made by Christ before his own glorification
 - ii. Day
 - 1. First Reading: the account in the Acts of the Apostles of the great occurrence on Pentecost day
 - 2. Second Reading: the effect of the action of the Spirit in the life of the Church
 - 3. Gospel:
 - a. Year A: Jesus bestowing his Spirit on the disciples on the evening of Easter day
 - b. Other Years: the action of the Spirit on the disciples and on the Church
- g. Ordinary Time
 - i. Gospel
 - 1. Second Sunday: continues to center on the manifestation of the Lord with the traditional passage about the wedding feast at Cana and two other passages from John [these three passages have been moved to the First Sunday (Baptism), the Second Sunday, and the Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time in Year D]
 - 2. Beginning with the Third Sunday [the Second Sunday in the proposed Lectionary], there is a semicontinuous reading of all four Gospels through the Thirty-Third Sunday
 - ii. First Reading: from the Old Testament, corresponds to the Gospel passage, to bring out the unity between the Old and the New Testament; many Old Testament texts of major significance are read on the basis of what the Gospel reading requires; nearly all the principal pages of the Old Testament will be read
 - iii. Second Reading: a semicontinuous reading of the Letters of Paul, James, [Jude, 2 John, 3 John, and 2 Peter] (1 Peter and 1 John being read during the Easter and Christmas seasons); the table at the end of this Introduction indicates the distribution of the Second Readings over the three-year cycle [four-year cycle in the proposed Lectionary] of the Sundays of Ordinary Time; [in the proposed Lectionary, more books are read, and the books are presented in chronological order,⁹ except for three of the longest books, which are presented in Year A (1 Corinthians and 2 Corinthians) and Year B (Romans) so that they would not have to be split over two years]

- h. Solemnities of the Lord in Ordinary Time
 - i. Holy Trinity, Corpus Christi, and the Sacred Heart: texts chosen correspond to the principal themes of these celebrations
 - ii. Thirty-Fourth and last Sunday celebrates Christ the Universal King, prefigured by David and proclaimed as king amid the humiliations of his passion and cross, who reigns in the Church and will come again at the end of time

Some of the principles used in the selection of new psalm passages are the following:

- 1) If a psalm is mentioned explicitly in the First Reading, then appropriate parts of that psalm are chosen as the Responsorial Psalm.
- If a First Reading is already found in the current Lectionary, then the Responsorial Psalm associated with that reading is the basis for the new Responsorial Psalm, unless principle 1 above applies.
- 3) Only continuous verses are used, that is, no verses are omitted in the range of verses chosen for the Responsorial Psalm.
- 4) The number of verses and "stanzas" in the Responsorial Psalms reflects the various lengths of the Responsorial Psalms in the current lectionary. (A "stanza" here means the combination of verses sung or read between one response and the next.) In the current lectionary for Sundays and weekdays, the number of verses varies from two to ten, and the number of stanzas varies from two to seven. (See Sunday in Ordinary Time Week 9 Year C [Ps 117:1, 2], Week 21 Year B [Ps 34:2-3, 16-17, 18-19, 20-21, 22-23], and Thursday in Ordinary Time Week 34 Year I [Dan 3:68, 69, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74].) A Common Text (OLM 174, Psalms) that may be used if sung on the Easter Vigil has twelve verses (Ps 136:1-3, 4-6, 7-9, 24-26). The more frequent structures are eight verses in four stanzas, and six verses in three stanzas. In the proposed Lectionary, a Responsorial Psalm consists of no more than nine verses.
- 5) On Sundays in the four-year cycle, the verses of the Responsorial Psalm are not used more than once, except that Ps 104:29-30 ("If you take away their breath, they perish and return to their dust. When you send forth your spirit, they are created, and you renew the face of the earth") are used on the vigil of Pentecost and also on the day of Pentecost, as in the current Lectionary.
- 6) Verses from the book of Psalms are chosen to replace Old or New Testament canticles so that all the "Responsorial Psalms" are indeed from the book of Psalms. The four Sunday canticles replaced are:

- Exod 15:1-18 from the Easter Vigil (Exod 15:1-21* will be the First Reading on Ordinary Time 26B);
- Isa 12:2-6 from Advent 3C, Baptism B, the Easter Vigil, and Sacred Heart B (Isa 12:1-6* will be the First Reading on Advent 3B);
- Dan 3:52-56 from the Vigil of Pentecost, extended form, and Holy Trinity A (Dan 3:46-56* will be the First Reading on Ordinary Time 33C); and
- Luke 1:46-54 from Advent 3B (Luke 1:39-56 is still the Gospel reading on the Solemnity of the Assumption).

The Responsorial Psalm for Easter 2A has been taken from Easter 3C. The Responsorial Psalm for Easter 5A has been taken from Ordinary Time 5C. The "Responsorial Psalm" following the reading from Exod 19:1-20* on Pentecost Vigil, extended form, has been dropped. (Dan 3:46-56 will be read on Ordinary Time 33C.) APPENDICES

Appendix 1: Proposed Gospel Readings for Sundays of Easter

The resurrection narratives comprise only the last chapter of each of the three Synoptic Gospels and the last two chapters of the Gospel of John. In this proposal to expand the Sunday Lectionary, with the addition of Year D all of the resurrection narratives in the four Gospels will be read in the four-year cycle of Sundays in the Easter Season. This would allow those resurrection readings to be heard by the greater number of faithful who attend only Sunday Mass but not Mass during the week. The result is the following proposed order of Gospel readings for Sundays in the season of Easter. The Sunday after Pentecost (Trinity Sunday) is also listed to show that the Gospel readings for Trinity Sunday do not overlap with those of Pentecost.

The Introduction to the current Lectionary states that, at the Vigil on the holy night of Easter, the Gospel reading is "the announcement of the Resurrection according to one of the Synoptic Gospels . . . The Gospel reading for the Mass on Easter day is from John on the finding of the empty tomb. There is also, however, the option to use the Gospel texts from the Easter Vigil or, when there is an evening Mass on Easter Sunday, to use the account in Luke of the Lord's appearance to the disciples on the road to Emmaus" (GIL 99).

For the rest of the Sundays of the Easter season, "The Gospel readings for the first three Sundays recount the appearances of the risen Christ. The readings about the Good Shepherd are assigned to the Fourth Sunday. On the Fifth, Sixth, and Seventh Sundays, there are excerpts from the Lord's discourse and prayer at the end of the Last Supper" (GIL 100). "Where the Ascension of the Lord is celebrated on the following [Seventh] Sunday, the Second Reading and Gospel given for the Seventh Sunday of Easter (nn. 59-61 [in the Order of Readings]) may be read on the Sixth Sunday of Easter" (see n. 57 in the Order of Readings).

In this draft proposal, the final chapters of the four Gospels (Matthew 28, Mark 16, Luke 24, and John 20–21) will be read in their entirety on the Sundays (and Ascension Thursday) of the Easter season. In general, the passages from Matthew will be read in Year A, from Mark in Year B, from Luke in Year C, and from John in Year D. At the Vigil on the holy night of Easter, the Gospel readings will recount the finding of the empty tomb and the announcement of the resurrection. The Gospel readings for the Mass on Easter day will recount the Lord's appearance to Mary Magdalene. When there is an evening Mass on Easter Sunday, the option will remain to use the account in Luke of the Lord's appearance to the disciples on the road to Emmaus.

On the Second Sunday of Easter in Years A, B, C, and D, the Gospel reading will be, as in the current Lectionary, from John 20:19-31, on the appearances of the risen Christ to the disciples and to Thomas.

On the Third and Fourth Sundays of Easter, the Gospel readings recount further appearances of the risen Christ, except for the Third Sunday Year A and the Fourth Sunday Years A and B, where passages in John's Gospel from the Lord's discourse at the Last Supper are read.

On the Fifth Sunday of Easter the Gospel readings will be about the Good Shepherd.

On the Sixth and Seventh Sundays, there will be additional excerpts from the Lord's discourse and prayer at the end of the Last Supper.

Since John 20:11-18 will now be the Gospel reading in Years C and D at the Mass for Easter day, it will be dropped as the reading for Tuesday in the Easter octave. The proposed Gospel readings for weekdays of the Easter octave will be as follows:

As a result of this new arrangement, the Gospels read more than once every four years on Easter Sunday will not be read on the weekdays of the Easter octave.

The Gospel reading for Trinity Sunday, Year A, has been changed from John 3:16-18 to John 14:15-20 because the current reading makes no mention of the Holy Spirit. (John 3:16-21 will be read on the Fourth Sunday of Lent, Year B.)

* * * * *

The passage from 1 Cor 15:1-11, where St. Paul lists the various appearances of the risen Lord, will be the Second Reading on the Seventh Sunday of Easter, Year C, after all the other appearances (including the ascension) will have been read. Year C is chosen because that is the year for the reading of Luke's Gospel, wherein mention is made of the appearance of Christ to Simon (Peter) in Luke 24:34. 1 Cor 15:5 mentions the appearance to Cephas (Peter).

* * * * *

The readings from 1 Peter on the Sixth and Seventh Sundays of Easter, Year A, have been expanded to include verses pertaining to the preaching of the Gospel to the dead, a possible reference to the article of the Apostles Creed "he descended into hell." The expanded readings also contain references to the resurrection or to life in the Spirit. On the Sixth Sunday, 1 Pet 3:15-18 is expanded to 1 Pet 3:13-22. On the Seventh Sunday, 1 Pet 4:13-16 is expanded to 1 Pet 4:5-16.
